Use these questions as a scavenger hunt to familiarize new audiences to PLT's *Green Jobs in Green Spaces* unit.



- 1. Name three benefits of green jobs.
 - Possible answers from the Introduction: they ensure environmental sustainability, they're a growing segment of the global economy, they can't be outsourced, they often pay well, they're often satisfying
- 2. Find "Ten STEM Skills for Everyone" and one "STEM It Up!" suggestion. Which STEM Skill(s) does the "STEM It Up!" suggestion use or develop? Answers will vary. The "Ten STEM Skills for Everyone" worksheet can be found in the Introduction and "STEM It Up!" suggestions can be found in each learning activity.
- 3. In which activity do learners research a forest career?
 Who Works in this Forest?
- 4. Name your favorite tip for conducting a successful informational interview.

 Answers will vary. The tips are listed in a box in the "Who Works in this Forest?" learning activity.
- Where might you find forestry professionals to meet with learners?
 Hint: There's a list of suggestions somewhere in the guide.

- 6. In which activity do learners create a management plan for a fictional forest?

- 7. Find a "Career Connections" callout box in one of the activities.

 How might you use the "Career Connection" suggestion provided with your audience?

- 8. Identify the seven indicators that learners use to assess the health of a forest stand.

 Tree and crown condition, forest diversity, lichen abundance, soil quality, regeneration, snags and course woody debris, and wildlife. These indicators are detailed in the student worksheets for Monitoring Forest Health.
- 9. Where can you find descriptions of example jobs that might conduct forest health assessments? In the Background section of the Monitoring Forest Health learning activity
- 10. Describe two different definitions of the term sustainability.
 The Seventh Generation Principle looks at the effect of a decision seven generations from now.
 The Triple Bottom Line approach measures sustainability in terms of environmental protection, economic prosperity and social well-being.
- 11. Where can you find examples of green jobs that can help countries meet the Sustainable Development Goals?

- 12. Name two job boards that learners might use to explore green careers.
