- Provide updated record book project forms from the current and previous 4-H years for judges to review for growth in the project at the fair

- Enrolled in a Food/Nutrition project at the fair
- Enter a minimum of 6 exhibits in a Food/Nutrition project at the fair
- Complete an interview for exhibits submitted at the fair
- Provide updated record book project forms from the current and previous 4-H years for judges to review for growth in the project at the fair

\$100 to go towards welding gear of your choice

- Enrolled in a Welding project at the fair
- Enter a minimum of 2 exhibits in a Welding project
- Complete an interview for exhibits submitted at the fair
- Provide updated record book project forms from the current and previous 4-H years for judges to review for growth in the project at fair

Sanders County 4-H Council Meeting October 2, 2024, 6:00 p.m.

Minutes of August Meeting were approved as presented.

No **Treasurer's Report** available. Budget Committee will meet and prepare the 2024-2025 proposal.

No correspondence received

Fair Wrap-up (Dining Hall) Juli presented a spreadsheet of dining hall expenses and income. We are about \$2000 short, nothing out of the ordinary, cook's salary was raised last year, three new roasters were purchased. Local food purchases may be less expensive. Food was ordered based on last two year use, but more people came this year, 20-100 for every meal. Food quality was good. Senior Citizen discount went over well – add military discount?

Meat raffle brought in over \$2500 at fair (thank you, Terry!), overall total was \$15,090. After costs and 5% to clubs, council profit is \$10,688. Top five sellers will receive gift cards (donated to 4-H): Josh Ekberg, John McNamara, Lainey Erwin, Brianna Horner, Mason Holman. Looking for donation of ½ beef verified prior to February, for next year's meat raffle. Suggested a club raffle officer to help with tracking, reminders, and mentoring.

Ambassadors hosted their best Fair dance ever. Air conditioning in pavilion was a nice addition. Will meet October 11, four new members so far, looking for members from different clubs.

Award banners for donations of \$250 and up were great and visible. Donor names were also on posters around the fair, on the website and an ad will be put in the paper. Expenses so far have been \$5905, fair and member awards have not been ordered yet. Expenses include fair and acheivment day awards, graduate stoles, ribbons, rosettes. Jen found scissors to be engraved for Fashion Revue winners from Fabric Pixie. Briefcases were suggested for communication days winners. Next year we may offer a jacket or other item with multiple awards listed. In addition to a general awards donation, Clark Fork Farms donated \$500 specifically "to help kids that are financially challenged."

Fair projects – Johnny Thurston completed framing of home ec building windows and will seal. Bid for flooring for the building is \$8000 for 4-H side, \$16000 for both sides. Other flooring ideas? Project pictures hanging from ceiling need glue. Hot water heater in the showers is impacted with bugs and a new unit is needed.

4-H week is October 7-12, Juli will post on Facebook daily, article will be sent to local newspapers, Mountaineers plan to decorate windows at four businesses with names of all county clubs. Comment from Ed Moreth (local newspaper journalist): Not a fan of kids, but loves every 4-H kid he has ever met! Fliers will be sent to schools explaining 4-H and how to join.

Achievement Day Potluck on November 10 will be hosted by Whitepine Club, 2:00pm at Fairgrounds Pavilion. Clubs will announce club awards but not present them until club meetings. Speaker will be Mikiah Cook.

Current slate of **officers** was approved by acclimation to serve the 2024-2025 4-H year: President Joanne Burke, Vice President Jen Avilla, Treasurer Carmen Jackson (training Terry Stephens), Secretary Karen Dwyer.

Karen made a motion for council to donate \$200 towards **Cody Hafner's trip** to National Congress in November. Motion carried.

Enrollments are due November 15. Lengthy discussion was held regarding criteria for a member in good standing. Wording for Expectations was updated to be more consistent.

Fair Improvements:

- Ryan and Bethany are working on the Jason Hanna sign.
- Raelyn & Carissa will look at the gates that need repaired in the sheep barn.
- Doug/Whitney hope to do some updates in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn. (Plywood walls, roof, new poultry pen supplies)
- New tin on swine barn. Taylor Construction bid \$11,000 to replace roofing and rotten boards underneath, rotten post and facing board. John Thurston bid \$10,250. Mahlon Lee bid approx. \$18,000 not to include any board replacement. Dallas Bender bid \$7500 plus \$10/8' length boards needed. Fair board might want to use old tin on the Pavilion walls. Juli has requested grant funds for this project from AgWest.
- The fair board has aluminum bleachers above the grand stands we could use at the show arena. They would like to use the ones we have as well. The new ones would need railing installed. Juli is getting a price on the railing. Do we want more bleachers around the show arena?
