Subject: MSU-related Travel Update



Dear Deans, Department Heads and Directors:

Given the recent sunsetting of the Healthy Montana University System (MUS) Planning Guidelines related to COVID-19 campus safety protocols, the Montana State University processes for university-related travel need to be updated. Specifically, the following updates are effective immediately:

- MSU International Travel: University-related travel to countries designated in the
 Level IV category by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is prohibited in accordance
 with the recent MUS directive. MSU will continue the requirement of Provost and/or
 VP-level review of international travel through the process outlined by the Office of
 International Programs for proposed travel to other countries (CDC designation Level IIII). See following link for additional details:

- MSU Domestic Travel: University-related travel within the United States returns to the pre-pandemic process. MSU no longer requires travelers to submit the "Faculty Pre-Travel Authorization for University-Affiliated Essential Domestic Travel Form." Effective immediately, the previously established MSU process for domestic travel requires only supervisor approval through the Chrome River process.
